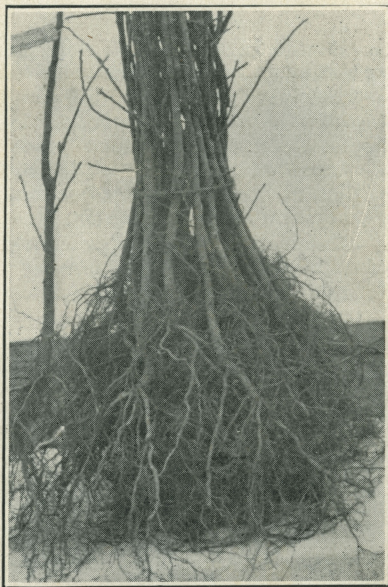

VARIETIES

(A brief description thereof and time of ripening.)

YORK IMPERIAL—Winter, medium to large, yellow shaded red, firm, juicy, sub-acid, an excellent canning and shipping apple, very good for export, October.

STAYMAN WINESAP—Large size, mostly covered red, crisp and juicy, tree a strong grower, ripens in October and ready for use soon after picking, keeps late into spring.

SUMMER RAMBO—Very large in size, greenish red striped, tender, mellow and juicy, tree strong grower. August 15th to Septemebr 15th.

WINTER RAMBO—Pale green, striped red; tender and crisp. Fine winter apple.

SMOKE HOUSE—One of the good old kind welcomed in every home. Ripens in September. Can be kept in common storage late into the winter.

GRIMES GOLDEN—Good size, yellow, of high quality, ripens in September, can be kept late into the winter. A fine eating apple.

WEALTHY—Fall apple. Good medium size, round or pointed, almost solid red, flesh white, crisp, juicy, bears young, August 1st to 15th.

YELLOW TRANSPARENT—Early summer, ripening early in July, skin a clear yellow, flesh white, juicy and slightly acid. Do well in low ground.

WINTER BANANA—Creamy white with rosy cheek, excellent for home use, but not good for large commercial plantings. Fancy apple.

EARLY RIPE—One of the earliest summer apples, ripening from the first to the middle of July, good size, pale yellow in color.

BALDWIN—An old-time favorite winter apple, medium size, mottled red and yellow. Reaches perfection in northern Pennsylvania and New York.

NORTHERN SPY—Large red winter apple; crisp and juicy. Does well in Northern States.

PARADISE—Large, rosy cheeked, one of best sweet winter varieties.

R. I. GREENING—Large winter, well adapted to all parts of the State.

ROME BEAUTY—Winter, large, round, mottled and striped in different shades of red, flavor and quality fine. Good late keeper.

DELICIOUS—(Sometimes called the Stark's Delicious.) Winter apple, one of the fine quality apples. Brilliant dark red shading to yellow at the blossom end.

POUND APPLE—Large old fashioned apple.

McINTOSH—Bright, deep red; fine quality. Ripens in September and keeps late into the winter in common storage. Popular for shipping. Much used as filler.

STARK—Large, mostly colored red, crisp and juicy, ripens in October.

CORTLAND—A cross between McIntosh and Ben Davis, beautiful large red. Keeps late in the winter. Ripens in October.

CRAB APPLE—Good size, mid-season.

These peach trees are as fine as can be grown, and will please buyers.

GOLDEN JUBILEE—Early Yellow, free stone, ripens before Carman, three weeks before Elberta. In quality holds up nearly as well as Elberta. In size and marketing, the best early peach.

CARMAN—White, semi-free stone, creamy white skin well covered with red, flesh white, slightly tinged with red, ripens about the last of July.

GREENSBORO—Best early variety. Flesh white. Large and beautifully colored. Ripens latter part of July.

SNEED—Fine juicy white peach, with red, extra early, about July 15.

HILEY (Hiley Early Bell)—Ripens last of July. Large size, delightful red cheek, flesh is white, tender and exceedingly juicy. Free. It is one of the best shippers among early peaches.

CHAMPION—A large, handsome, early variety. Creamy white with red cheek; sweet, rich and juicy; hardy and productive. August 1.

SOUTH HAVEN—Brilliant yellow with blush of red. Splendid flavor. Small seed, freestone. Ripens two weeks before Elberta.

BELLE OF GEORGIA—Very large peach with red cheek; flesh white and firm, of excellent flavor; fine shipper. August 1 to 15.

FULTON—White, free, very large, creamy-white coloring to a beautiful red. Ripens August 10th to the 25th. Fine market peach. Will not hold well for long shipments.

EARLY ELBERTA—Ripens ten days before Elberta, fine yellow, freestone.

ELBERTA—Yellow, free, large in size, yellow skin with deep red cheek, flesh is golden yellow, firm and juicy, ripens from August 15th to September 1st. Easily the leader among the commercial peaches. The old original Elberta.

LATE ELBERTA—One of the best of the late varieties, ripening about 10 days after Elberta. It is of large size, with yellow flesh. Very desirable market peach.

FOX SEEDLING—White, partly covered with red. A fine-flavored peach of good size and a splendid market variety. September 1 to 15.

ROCHESTER—Fine yellow peach, ripens two weeks before Elberta.

MCALISTER—A late yellow, good shipper, ripens after most all commercial varieties. Heavy bearer.

J. H. HALE—Yellow; large, flesh deep yellow. For appearance it is without equal.

CRAWFORDS LATE—Large yellow, free stone. Ripens after Elberta.

BEER SMOCK—Yellow, freestone, an old-time favorite ripening about the middle of September, flesh dense, rich and good.

IRON MOUNTAIN—A fine late white peach, and an excellent market sort. Tree hardy; strong grower. September 20 to October 1.

SHIPPER'S LATE RED—Freestone. Fine yellow peach. As large as Hale, a much better bearer. Ripens ten days after Elberta.

SALWAY—A late yellow variety. Latter part of September. Good canner.

ROBERTA—Ripens 10 days later than Hale and Elberta, large yellow.

WILMA—Large yellow, free stone. Ripens late in October.
